When Leslie retired in 2005, she became more active volunteering in the community because giving back to others has always been her life's passion.

Leslie counts a loving family and enriching friendships among her many blessings. She and her husband, Ron Weingartner, live in Dartmouth, and have a grown son.

Leslie drew strength and inspiration from her mother, Isabel, who also had a giving spirit. After Isabel entered remission, she shared her cancer story with other patients to give them peace of mind.
